

Pro-homosexual Legislation in the PA House

Last week the Pennsylvania State Legislature once again voted on House Bill 302. This pro-homosexual legislation would require Pennsylvania's anti-discrimination laws to now include the words "Sexual Orientation" in the regulations dealing with Pennsylvania's foster care system.

This radical piece of legislation was defeated by a 1-vote margin (99-98), largely on party lines. Although 89 Republicans and 10 Conservative Democrats worked together to oppose this extreme liberal bill, there were 11 Republicans who broke from the party and sided with the Democrats. One of the 11 was State Representative Karen Boback.

My concern is not that Karen Boback voted with the liberal Democrats over the Republicans and Conservative Democrats. The issue for me is that she sided with the radical agenda of the pro-homosexual community rather than the majority of the pro-family constituents in her district.

The Republican Party is not perfect, and there may be times when it becomes necessary to vote against the party. This, however, was not such a time.
